What is GGP?

Grant Assistance for Grassroots Human Security Projects (GGP) is a small-scale assistance scheme offered by the Government of Japan since 1989. It provides financial support to non-profit organisations for implementing projects aimed for economic and social development at the grassroots level in the areas such as health, education and poverty relief.

In Mauritius, since the opening of the Embassy of Japan in 2017, six initiatives have been taken throughout Mauritius Island and Rodrigues Island as of October 2023.



Our Previous Initiatives



1. FY 2018

“The Project for Introducing Digital Mammography Equipment in the Dr A.G. Jeetoo Hospital”

Recipient Organisation: Dr A.G. Jeetoo Hospital

Outline: Installing one digital mammography equipment

Through this project, the hospital installed one digital mammography equipment and capacity of public hospitals for mammography screening for breast cancer detection has been doubled.

2. FY 2019

“The Project for Introducing Digital Mammography Equipment in the Queen Elizabeth Hospital”

Through this project, the hospital installed first digital mammography equipment in the Rodrigues island and more than 12,000 women in Rodrigues can now receive mammography screening without travelling to Mauritius.

“The Project for Bus Procurement for People with Disabilities in Poste de Flacq”

Providing two 15-seater buses



Through this project, the NGO acquired two buses for free-of-charge and safe transportation and home visit services for the students of “Joie de Vivre”, the special education needs school, ensuring the beneficiaries access to education and other supports.

4. FY 2021

“The Project for Introducing Ultrasound Machine for Breast Cancer Screening Caravan”

Outline: Providing two portable ultrasound machines



Through this project, the NGO acquired two ultrasound machines to provide breast screening for free aimed at early detection of breast cancer to 2,500-3,000 women on a yearly basis in the vulnerable regions.

5. FY 2022

“The Project for Procurement of Bus to Provide Learning and Food Support in the Midwestern Mauritius”

Outline: Providing one 15-seater bus



Through this project, the NGO acquired one bus to provide safe transportation for children in the NGO's after school programme and food distribution support to children and their families in need.

6. FY 2022

“The Project for Provision of Ultrasound Machines for Gynecological and Abdomen Screening and Vehicle”

Outline: Installing two ultrasound machines and one 7-seater vehicle



Through this project, the NGO acquired two ultrasound machines and one vehicle to provide gynaecological and abdomen screening services at the NGO's clinic and communities to contribute to early detection of cancers.

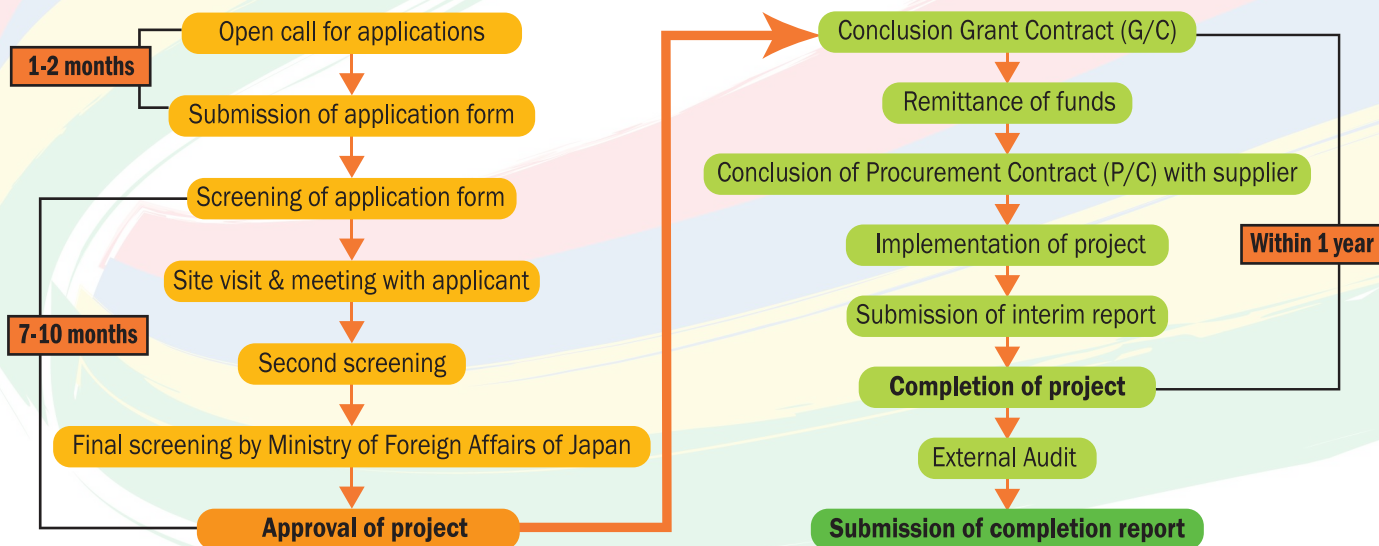
