Development Issue 1-1 Environment, Climate Change and Disaster Risk Reduction	[Background and current situation] As Mauritius aims for further economic development, the next challenge is to consider environmental costs to support sustainable development and economic growth. Mauritius's geographical characteristics make it vulnerable to the effects of natural disasters and climate change, such as cyclones and floods caused by sudden heavy rains, and the establishment of a disaster risk reduction system to minimize damage is an urgent issue.			[Strategy] Japan will support Mauritius's adaptation and mitigation efforts against climate change, and to develop disaster risk reduction systems and related human resources to cope with slope disasters and floods caused by frequent heavy rains. In addition, support will be provided to strengthen the country's capacities to prevent disasters other than natural disasters, such as maritime incidents. For the environment sector, based on the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework, which was adopted in December 2022, the initiatives that contribute to biodiversity conservation or take biodiversity into account will be supported.
