

GUIDELINE FOR JAPAN'S GRANT ASSISTANCE FOR GRASSROOTS HUMAN SECURITY PROJECTS (THE GGP/KUSANONE)

1. What is GGP?

Grant Assistance for Grassroots Human Security Projects (GGP) is a small-scale assistance scheme offered by the Government of Japan since 1989. It provides financial support to non-profit organisations for implementing projects aimed at economic and social development at the grassroots level in areas such as health, education and poverty relief.

3. What GGP funds and does not fund (examples)

4. Available Funds

The maximum grant amount per project is 10 million Japanese yen (approximately MUR 2.8 million).

- (1) Fill in the application form and prepare required documents.
- (2) Submit a complete set of application documents to the Embassy of Japan in Mauritius by email (NOT ACCEPTABLE BY POST OR DROP-OFF).
